General Education and Pre-Education advising for candidates seeking certification in the following grade bands and endorsements:

- Early Childhood (Birth-Kindergarten)
- Lower Elementary (PreK through Grade 3)
- Upper Elementary (Grades 3 through 6)
- K-12 Specialty Endorsements: Special Education, English as a Second Language, French, or Spanish (must also choose Early Childhood, Lower Elementary or Upper Elementary)
- **K-8 Content Endorsements**: Integrated Science (41 cr.) Language Arts (36 cr.), Social Studies (40-41cr.) (must also choose Upper Elementary Grades 3 through 6)

University Basic Skills Requirements: Math MATH 081 (2 cr.), MATH 082 (4 cr.); **Writing** ENGL 080 (3 cr.) and ENGL 111 (3 cr.); **Reading** ENGL 103 (4 cr.) or ENGL 104 (3cr.)

2 Communication Intensive (!) courses are required for graduation and can be taken from the General Education and Pre-Education courses listed in bold, italicized type ending with an exclamation mark (!). English 111 or its equivalent obtained through testing, transfer, etc., is a requisite for enrollment in all communication-intensive courses.
